SUBJECT: NAMING OF THE NEW PRIMARY AND SECONDARY SCHOOLS LOCATED IN SOUTH RIPLEY

Summary of key objectives

- To seek the Minister's approval to officially name the new state primary school located on Botany Drive, South Ripley, scheduled to open on 28 January 2020, as Ripley Valley State Primary College.
- To seek the Minister's approval to officially name the new state secondary school located on Parkway Avenue, South Ripley, scheduled to open on 28 January 2020, as Ripley Valley State Secondary College.
- To request the Minister sign the letter to the Honourable Annastacia Palaszczuk MP, Premier and Minister for Trade, advising the proposed names for the schools and seeking urgent advice by 24 September 2019, if there are any concerns with the proposed names (Attachment 1).
- To request the Minister sign letters to be sent on 30 September 2019, provided the Premier has not raised any concerns about the proposed names, to:
 - Mrs Naomi Meerwald, Principal, Ripley Valley State Primary College (Attachment 2);
 - Mr Brendan Krueger, Principal, Ripley Valley State Secondary College (Attachment 3);
 - Mr Greg Chemello, Interim Administrator, City of Ipswich (Attachment 4);
 - Mrs Jo-Ann Miller MP, Member for Bundamba (Attachment 5); and
 - Mr Shayne Neumann MP, Member for Blair (Attachment 6).

Key issues

- Approval of the school names is required to progress establishment of enrolments, uniforms, logos, bank accounts, official domain and websites, school signage and advertising campaigns.
- A public announcement of the school names will allow enrolment processes to commence, ensuring the schools open with strong student enrolments on the first day of Term 1, 2020.
- 3. Mrs Meerwald has been appointed as the Principal of the new state primary school.
- 4. Mr Krueger has been appointed as the Principal of the new state secondary college.
- There are no other Queensland schools where there may be a conflict with regard to the proposed name of Ripley Valley State Primary College or Ripley Valley State Secondary College.
- 6. Mrs Meerwald and Mr Kreuger commenced community consultation regarding the naming of the new schools in June 2019.
- Mrs Meerwald and Mr Kreuger consulted with State and Federal Members of Parliament regarding the proposed names. The Local Council is currently under administration and was unable to participate in this process.

Throughout the consultation, Mrs Meerwald and Mr Krueger also communicated with State and Federal Members of Parliament, principals of local primary schools and high schools, parents/carers of prospective students from local primary schools, parents/carers of prospective students living within the proposed 2020 school catchment areas, local businesses, and local community members.

- Mrs Meerwald and Mr Krueger liaised with members of the Metropolitan Regional Office's Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Education team, local Indigenous Elders and the Ipswich City Council's Indigenous Development Officer regarding the naming suggestions.
- Temporary school Facebook pages have been established with regular communication with the school community occurring.
- 11. On 23 June 2019, naming surveys were sent to Raceview State School, Amberley District State School and Deebing Heights State School and asked that they were shared with their school communities via school websites and Facebook pages and that notices of community consultations be placed in their school newsletters. Survey forms were also sent to the Providence Community Hub and Minka Place at Eco Ripley and advertised through their internal and extended newsletters and Facebook pages. The surveys were also available on the new primary and secondary schools' temporary Facebook pages for community input.
- On 30 June 2019, approximately 80 people attended the community information and consultation evening held at Providence Community Hall.
- 13. On 31 June 2019, approximately 50 people attended the community information and consultation evening at held Minka Place in Eco Ripley.
- 14. On 8 August 2019, approximately 100 people attended the community information and consultation evening heid at Deebing Heights State School.
- 15. During these information sessions, requirements of the Department of Education's Naming of Departmental Assets procedure were shared and attendees were asked to nominate options for the school names.
- 16. While the Naming of Departmental Assets procedure does not explicitly include the use of the word 'college' in a primary context, there are other precedents for this, including Talara Primary College (P–6) and Pimpama State Primary College, and a number of other schools that do not offer Prep to Year 12 yet have the word 'college' in their name.
- 17. Given the preference for the neighbouring new secondary school to be named Ripley Valley State Secondary College and to assist in consistency of naming and branding to the community, it is proposed to name the primary school Ripley Valley State Primary College. This would result in the two new state schools presenting a united front to this emerging community.
- 13. On 13 August 2019, Mrs Meerwald and Mr Krueger identified the three most popular prefix name suggestions Ripley Valley, South Ripley and Ripley. An online and hardcopy survey was conducted from 13 August 2019 to 23 August 2019 through the new schools' temporary Facebook pages, nearby schools' Facebook pages and newsletters.
- 19. There were 947 responses to the primary school survey with the following results:
 - Ripley Valley 65.26%;
 - South Ripley 24.6%; and
 - Ripley 10.14%.
- 20. There were 961 responses to the secondary school survey, with 64% favouring Ripley Valley as the prefix name for the secondary school, and that from this result, 32.78% preferred State High School and 31.22% preferred State Secondary College.

- 21. Due to the close result for the secondary school suffix name, the feedback results were discussed in detail with the Community Advisory Committee on 27 August 2019. As a result of this meeting and subsequent discussion, the Community Advisory Committee unanimously recommended the name of the new secondary school be named Ripley Valley State Secondary College (Attachment 7).

Media implications and opportunities

22. A media release will be drafted by Strategic Community and Engagement to announce the name of the schools, should the Premier endorse and the Minister approve the proposed names of Ripley Valley State Primary College and Ripley Valley State Secondary College.

Financial implications

23. The cost of branding Ripley Valley State Primary College and Ripley Valley State Secondary College will be met from the schools' operational budgets.

Legal implications

24. Under section 16 of the *Education (General Provisions)* Act 2006, the Minister may name, and change the name, of a state educational institution. There are no associated legal implications.

Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander impacts

25. The Indigenous Elders of the local region were consulted and there have been no Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander impacts identified.

Background

- 26. The new primary school and secondary schools at South Ripley are in Stage 1 of construction and are two of eight new schools to open across Queensland in 2020. The new primary school is purpose built to accommodate Prep to Year 6 students and the new secondary school will accommodate Years 7 to 12 students.
- 27. The primary school will open in 2020 for an estimated 200 students.
- 28. The secondary school will open in 2020 with an anticipated enrolment of 120 students.
- 29. In accordance with the department's *Naming of Departmental Assets* procedure, school names should promote the school's location or identity while reflecting local and community sensibilities. Appropriate names may include:
 - locality or other local names of geographical significance, for example 'Glasshouse Mountains';
 - names of local flora or fauna;
 - local Indigenous names; or
 - marking cultural or heritage significance.
- 30. The primary school is located on Botany Drive, South Ripley, and adjoins the new secondary school located on Parkway Avenue, South Ripley. Following the community consultation process and school naming survey responses, it is proposed that the two new schools should share the first part of their respective school names, e.g. Ripley Valley.
- 31. Ripley Valley is used by local residents, business owners and community to describe the larger community area within this Ipswich corridor.
- 32. Ripley Valley State Primary College and Ripley Valley State Secondary College satisfy the protocols required when determining a name for a built asset belonging to the department.

Recommendation

That the Minister:

- approve the name Ripley Valley State Primary College as the official name for the new primary school to be opened on the corner of Botany Drive and Providence Parade, South Ripley, on 28 January 2020;
- approve the name Ripley Valley State Secondary College as the official name for the new secondary school to be opened on the corner of Parkway Avenue and Providence Parade, South Ripley, on 28 January 2020
- sign the letter to the Honourable Annastacia Palaszczuk MP, Premier and Minister for Trade, advising about the proposed names for the schools and seeking urgent advice by 24 September 2019, if there are any concerns with the proposed names (Attachment 1); and
- sign the letters to be sent on 30 September 2019, provided the Premier has not raised any concerns about the proposed names, to:
 - Mrs Naomi Meerwald, Principal, Ripley Valley State Primary College (Attachment 2);
 - Mr Brendan Krueger, Principal, Ripley Valley State Secondary College (Attachment 3);
 - Mr Greg Chemello, Interim Administrator, City of Inswich (Attachment 4);
 - Mrs Jo-Ann Miller MP, Member for Bundamba (Attachment 5); and
 - Mr Shayne Neumann MP, Member for Blair (Attachment 6).

Dear Premier

I am writing to advise you about the proposed names of the new primary and secondary schools in South Ripley being delivered under the Palaszczuk Government's \$1.3 billion Building Future Schools Fund for commencement from the 2020 school year.

Under section 16 of the *Education (General Provisions) Act 2006,* as Minister for Education, I have the power to name state educational institutions, including schools. I propose to name the new primary school on Botany Drive, South Ripley, the Ripley Valley State Primary College. I propose to name the new secondary school on Parkway Avenue, South Ripley, as Ripley Valley State Secondary College. The proposed names accord with the Department of Education's Naming of Departmental Assets procedure.

I am advised that the preferred names were determined following significant community consultation. The State and Federal Members of Parliament have endorsed the names. The local council is under administration and was unable to participate in this process.

The naming of both schools needs to be finalised as soon as possible to enable the school administration to progress the establishment of uniforms, logos, bank accounts, official domains and websites, school signage and advertising campaigns and enrolment processes for commencement of the 2020 school year.

The new primary school, accommodating students from Prep to Year 6, and the new secondary school, accommodating Years 7 to 12, will service the rapidly growing Ripley Valley region.

Accordingly, any concerns you have with the proposed names would be appreciated by close of business, 24 September 2019.



Believe it or not - new Ripley Valley schools officially named

Education Minister Grace Grace today officially announced the names of two new state schools currently under construction at Providence in Ripley Valley, just south of Ipswich.

Ms Grace said the both the primary and secondary school would be named after the local area.

"The new \$70 million (GST inclusive) state high school located at the corner of Providence Parade and Parkway Avenue will be named Ripley Valley State Secondary College," Ms Grace said.

"Likewise, Ripley Valley State Primary College is the name selected for the new \$50 million (GST inclusive) state primary school at the corner of Providence Parade and Botany Drive.

"These names have been chosen following a period of consultation with a wide range of stakeholders, including many parents whose children will attend the schools next year."

Ms Grace said Ripley Valley State Secondary College would open in 2020 for Years 7 and 8, continuing to grow by one year level each year to offer Years 7 to 12 by 2024.

"Stage 1 will deliver an administration building, junior applied technology and design graphics centre, robotics centre, business, fashion and graphic design centre, plus a range of flexible general learning spaces," she said.

"The school will also open with a sports field, hospitality centre, art and design centre, senior applied technology centre and indoor and outdoor sports courts."

Ms Grace said the nearby Ripley Valley State Primary College would include an administration building, canteen and resource centre, a multi-purpose hall and oval, as well as areas for prep and general learning.

"Stage 1 will be completed ready to open at the start of the 2020 school year, for Prep to Year 6 students," she said.

"Our goal is to deliver two new schools which best meet the educational needs of local students, in line with community expectations."

Ripley Valley State Secondary College Foundation Principal, Brendan Krueger, said his new school community were very pleased to be involved in the name selection process.

"We consulted with the local community through open community forums attended by a large and diverse range of local people," Mr Krueger said.

"We also surveyed the local community online to ask about a number of proposed names and established a community advisory committee which is closely involved with all decisions relating to the new school.

"It's been a collaborative process that has resulted in a name that I am confident the majority of local people support."

Ms Grace said construction is progressing well, with both schools on track to open in 2020.

"We are pleased to be delivering these new schools under the \$1.3 billion Building Future Schools Fund, which is supporting growing communities across the state," she said.

"The new schools in Ripley Valley are two of eight new state schools set to open across Queensland next year.

"This represents an investment of \$483 million (GST inclusive), supporting up to an estimated 1449 full-time jobs."

SUBJECT: NAMING OF THE NEW PRIMARY AND SECONDARY SCHOOLS LOCATED IN SOUTH RIPLEY

Summary of key objectives

- To seek the Minister's approval to officially name the new state primary school located on Botany Drive, South Ripley, scheduled to open on 28 January 2020, as Ripley Valley State Primary College.
- To seek the Minister's approval to officially name the new state secondary school located on Parkway Avenue, South Ripley, scheduled to open on 28 January 2020, as Ripley Valley State Secondary College.
- To request the Minister sign the letter to the Honourable Annastacia Palaszczuk MP, Premier and Minister for Trade, advising the proposed names for the schools and seeking urgent advice by 24 September 2019, if there are any concerns with the proposed names (Attachment 1).
- To request the Minister sign letters to be sent on 30 September 2019, provided the Premier has not raised any concerns about the proposed names, to:
 - Mrs Naomi Meerwald, Principal, Ripley Valley State Primary College (Attachment 2);
 - Mr Brendan Krueger, Principal, Ripley Valley State Secondary College (Attaciment 3);
 - Mr Greg Chemello, Interim Administrator, City of Ipswich (Attachment 4);
 - Mrs Jo-Ann Miller MP, Member for Bundamba (Attachment 5); and
 - Mr Shayne Neumann MP, Member for Blair (Attachment 6).

Key issues

- 1. Approval of the school names is required to progress establishment of enrolments, uniforms, logos, bank accounts, official domain and websites, school signage and advertising campaigns.
- A public announcement of the school names will allow enrolment processes to commence, ensuring the schools open with strong student enrolments on the first day of Term 1, 2020.
- 3. Mrs Meerwald has been appointed as the Principal of the new state primary school.
- 4. Mr Krueger has been appointed as the Principal of the new state secondary college.
- There are no other Queensland schools where there may be a conflict with regard to the proposed name of Ripley Valley State Primary College or Ripley Valley State Secondary College.
- Mrs Meerwald and Mr Kreuger commenced community consultation regarding the naming of the new schools in June 2019.
- Mrs Meerwald and Mr Kreuger consulted with State and Federal Members of Parliament regarding the proposed names. The Local Council is currently under administration and was unable to participate in this process.

Throughout the consultation, Mrs Meerwald and Mr Krueger also communicated with State and Federal Members of Parliament, principals of local primary schools and high schools, parents/carers of prospective students from local primary schools, parents/carers of prospective students living within the proposed 2020 school catchment areas, local businesses, and local community members.

- Mrs Meerwald and Mr Krueger liaised with members of the Metropolitan Regional Office's Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Education team, local Indigenous Elders and the Ipswich City Council's Indigenous Development Officer regarding the naming suggestions.
- 10. Temporary school Facebook pages have been established with regular communication with the school community occurring.
- 11. On 23 June 2019, naming surveys were sent to Raceview State School, Amberley District State School and Deebing Heights State School and asked that they were shared with their school communities via school websites and Facebook pages and that notices of community consultations be placed in their school newsletters. Survey forms were also sent to the Providence Community Hub and Minka Place at Eco Ripley and advertised through their internal and extended newsletters and Facebook pages. The surveys were also available on the new primary and secondary schools' temporary Facebook pages for community input.
- 12. On 30 June 2019, approximately 50 people attended the community information and consultation evening held at Providence Community Hall.
- 13. On 31 June 2019, approximately 50 people attended the community information and consultation evening at heid Minka Place in Eco Ripley.
- 14. On 8 August 2019, approximately 100 people attended the community information and consultation evening heid at Deebing Heigh's State School.
- 15. During these information sessions, requirements of the Department of Education's Naming of Departmente! Assets procedure were shared and attendees were asked to nominate options for the school names.
- 16. While the Naming of Departmental Assets procedure does not explicitly include the use of the word 'college' in a primary context, there are other precedents for this, including Talara Primary College (P–6) and Pimpama State Primary College, and a number of other schools that do not offer Prep to Year 12 yet have the word 'college' in their name.
- 17. Given the preference for the neighbouring new secondary school to be named Ripley Valley State Secondary College and to assist in consistency of naming and branding to the community, it is proposed to name the primary school Ripley Valley State Primary College. This would result in the two new state schools presenting a united front to this emerging community.
- 18. On 13 August 2019, Mrs Meerwald and Mr Krueger identified the three most popular prefix name suggestions Ripley Valley, South Ripley and Ripley. An online and hardcopy survey was conducted from 13 August 2019 to 23 August 2019 through the new schools' temporary Facebook pages, nearby schools' Facebook pages and newsletters.
- 19. There were 947 responses to the primary school survey with the following results:
 - Ripley Valley 65.26%;
 - South Ripley 24.6%; and
 - Ripley 10.14%.
- 20. There were 961 responses to the secondary school survey, with 64% favouring Ripley Valley as the prefix name for the secondary school, and that from this result, 32.78% preferred State High School and 31.22% preferred State Secondary College.

21. Due to the close result for the secondary school suffix name, the feedback results were discussed in detail with the Community Advisory Committee on 27 August 2019. As a result of this meeting and subsequent discussion, the Community Advisory Committee unanimously recommended the name of the new secondary school be named Ripley Valley State Secondary College (Attachment 7).

Media implications and opportunities

22. A media release will be drafted by Strategic Community and Engagement to announce the name of the schools, should the Premier endorse and the Minister approve the proposed names of Ripley Valley State Primary College and Ripley Valley State Secondary College.

Financial implications

23. The cost of branding Ripley Valley State Primary College and Ripley Valley State Secondary College will be met from the schools' operational budgets.

Legal implications

 Under section 16 of the Education (General Provisions) Act 2006, the Minister may name, and change the name, of a state educational institution. There are no associated legal implications.

Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander impacts

25. The Indigenous Elders of the local region were consulted and there have been no Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander impacts identified.

Background

- 26. The new primary school and secondary schools at South Ripley are in Stage 1 of construction and are two of eight new schools to open across Queensland in 2020. The new primary school is purpose built to accommodate Prep to Year 6 students and the new secondary school will accommodate Years 7 to 12 students.
- 27. The primary school will open in 2020 for an estimated 200 students.
- 28. The secondary school will open in 2020 with an anticipated enrolment of 120 students.
- 29. In accordance with the department's *Naming of Departmental Assets* procedure, school names should promote the school's location or identity while reflecting local and community sensibilities. Appropriate names may include:
 - locality or other local names of geographical significance, for example 'Glasshouse Mountains';
 - names of local flora or fauna;
 - local Indigenous names; or
 - marking cultural or heritage significance.
- 30. The primary school is located on Botany Drive, South Ripley, and adjoins the new secondary school located on Parkway Avenue, South Ripley. Following the community consultation process and school naming survey responses, it is proposed that the two new schools should share the first part of their respective school names, e.g. Ripley Valley.
- 31. Ripley Valley is used by local residents, business owners and community to describe the larger community area within this Ipswich corridor.
- 32. Ripley Valley State Primary College and Ripley Valley State Secondary College satisfy the protocols required when determining a name for a built asset belonging to the department.

Under section 16 of the *Education (General Provisions) Act 2006,* as Minister for Education, I have the power to name state educational institutions, including schools. I propose to name the new primary school on Botany Drive, South Ripley, the Ripley Valley State Primary College. I propose to name the new secondary school on Parkway Avenue, South Ripley, as Ripley Valley State Secondary College. The proposed names accord with the Department of Education's *Naming of Departmental Assets* procedure.



Summary of key objectives

- To seek the Minister's approval to officially name the new state primary school located on Botany Drive, South Ripley, scheduled to open on 28 January 2020, as Ripley Valley State School.
- To request the Minister sign the letter to the Honourable Annastacia Palaszczuk MP, Premier and Minister for Trade, advising about the proposed name for the school and seeking urgent advice by 26 August 2019, if there are any concerns with the proposed name (Attachment 1).
- To request the Minister sign the letters to be sent on 26 August 2019, provided the Premier has not raised any concerns about the proposed name to:
 - Mrs Naomi Meerwald, Principal (Attachment 2);
 - Interim Administrator Mr Greg Chamello, City of Ipswich (Attachment 3);
 - Mrs -Jo-Ann Miller, Member for Bundamba (Attachment 4), and
 - Shayne Neumann MP, Member for Blair (Attachment 5).

Key issues

- 1. Approval of the school name is required to progress establishment of enrolments, uniforms, logos, bank accounts, official domain and websites, school signage and advertising campaigns.
- A public announcement of the school name will allow for enrolment processes to commence, ensuring the school opens with a strong student enrolment on the first day of Term 1, 2020.
- 3. Mrs Naomi Meerwald has been appointed as the Principal of the new state school.
- 4. There are no other Queensland schools where there may be a conflict with regard to the proposed name of Ripley Valley State School.
- Mrs <u>Naomi</u> Meerwald commenced community consultation regarding the naming of the new school in June 2019.
- Mrs <u>Naomi</u> Meerwald has consulted <u>with State and Federal Members of</u> <u>Parliament</u>forregarding the proposed name, <u>with State and Federal Members of Parliament</u>. The <u>ILocal c</u>Council is <u>currently</u> under administration and was unable to participate in this process.
- 7. Throughout the consultation, Mrs <u>Naomi</u> Meerwald communicated with State and Federal Members of Parliament, principals of local primary schools and high schools, parents/carers of prospective students from local primary schools, parents/carers of prospective students



living within the proposed 2020 school catchment area, local businesses, and local community members.

- Mrs <u>Naomi</u> Meerwald liaised with members of the <u>Department-of Education's</u> Metropolitan Region's al <u>Office's</u> Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander team, local Indigenous Elders and the <u>Ipswich City Council's</u>council Indigenous development officer regarding the naming suggestions.
- 9. A temporary school Facebook page has been established with regular communication with the school community occurring.
- 10. On 30 June 2019, approximately 80 people attended the Community Information and Consultation evening held at Providence Community Hall. On 31 June 2019 approximately 50 people attended the Community Information and Consultation at Mink Place in Eco Ripley. On the 8th August 2019 approximately 100 people attended the Community Information and Consultation evening held at Deebing Heights State School. Requirements of the department's Naming of Departmental Assets Procedure (the Procedure) were shared and attendees were asked to nominate options for the school name.
- 11. On 23 June 2019 naming surveys were sent to Raceview State SchoolS, Amberley District State SchoolS and Deebing Heights State SchoolS and asked that they were shared with their school communities via to be placed on their school websites and Facebook pages and that notices of community consultations placed in their school newsletters. Survey forms were also sent to the Providence Community Hub, and Minka Place at Eco Ripley and advertised via their internal and extended newsletters and Facebook pages. The survey was also available posted on the Primary and High school temporary facebook pages for community input.
- 12. Three names were proposed and on 8 June 2019 the three most popular options were surveyed for feedback via paper and online survey. A <u>SsurveyM-monkey</u> was conducted <u>from</u> <u>13 June 2019 to 22 June 2019</u> via the new school temperary Facebook Page and a s from 13 <u>-22 June 2019</u>, with a paper-hard copy version available for <u>Community Information and</u> <u>C</u>eonsultation <u>meetings.</u>-

- To request the Minister to sign letters to be sent on 24 June 2019, provided the Premier has not raised any concerns about the proposed name, to:
 - Mrs Belinda Tregea, Principal, Yarrabiiba State Secondary College (Attachment 2);
 - Mr Linus Power MP, Member for Legan (Attachment 3); and

Key issues

- 1. Approval of the new secondary school name is required to progress establishment of enrolments, uniforms, logos, bank accounts, official domain and websites, school signage and advertising campaigns.
- 2. Public announcement of the school name will allow enrolment processes to commence, ensuring the school opens with a strong student enrolment on the first day of Term 1, 2020.
- 3. There are no other Queensland schools where there may be a conflict with regard to the name Yarrabilba State Secondary College.

- 7. Throughout a four-week consultation period, Mrs Tregea communicated with the State and Federal Members of Parliament and representatives from the Legan City Council; principals of local state and non-state primary schools; principals of the local high schools; Yarrabilba Connect (formerly the Yarrabilba Community Association); parents and carers of prospective students living within the proposed 2020 catchment area; prospective parents of students attending the local primary schools; representatives of Lend Lease Development Corporation; stakeholders in 'The Hive' proposed community hub connected to the high school; and local business owners.
- 8. Additional consultation included surveys distributed via local primary schools and the school's Facebook page describing the naming process and seeking community feedback and in person when Mrs Tregea attended the 15 May 2019 meeting of Yarrabilba Connect.
- 9. On 23 May 2019, Mrs Tregea hosted a community meeting at Yarrabilba State School attended by more than 220 people, including local Indigenous families, business owners, Mrs Lee Harrex, Principal, Yarrabilba State School, and the Member for Logan.
- 10. At the community meeting, requirements of the Department of Education's Naming of Departmental Assets procedure (the Procedure) were shared, and the attendees were asked to nominate options for a new school name. A survey was conducted to determine the preferences of the attendees. Yarrabilba State Secondary College was clearly identified as the preferred name of the school and received an overwhelming majority of the votes.
- 11. A letter has been drafted for the Minister to sign, requesting that the Premier agree to name the new school at Yarrabiba, Yarrabiba State Secondary College (Attachment 1).

Media implications

12. A media release will be drafted by Strategic Communication and Engagement to announce the name of the school, should the Premier endorse the Minister approving the proposed name of Yarrabilba State Secondary College.

Legal implications

13. Under section 16 of the Education (General Provisions) Act 2006, the Minister may name, and change the name, of a state educational institution. There are no associated legal implications.

Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander impacts

14. Yarracilba means 'place of song' in the local Yugambeh language and acknowledges the peoples who occupied the land before European settlement.

Background

- 15. Yarrabilba State Secondary College is in mid-Stage 1 construction and is one of eight new schools scheduled to open across Queensland in 2020. The new school is purpose-built to accommodate Years 7 to 12; however, will open in 2020 with Years 7 and 8.
- 16. In accordance with the Procedure, school names should promote the school's location or identity while respecting local and community sensibilities. Appropriate names include:
 - locality or other local names of geographical significance, for example 'Yarrabilba';
 - names of local flora or fauna;
 - local Indigenous names; or
 - marking cultural or heritage significance.

17. The Procedure also mandates the inclusion of 'State' for secondary schools.

- 9. A temporary school Facebook page has been established with regular communication with the school community occurring.
- 10. On 30 June 2019, approximately 80 people attended the Community Information and Consultation evening held at Providence Community Hall. On 31 June 2019 approximately 50 people attended the Community Information and Consultation at Mink Place in Eco Ripley. On the 8th August approximately 100 people attended the Community Information and Consultation evening held at Deebing Heights State School. Requirements of the department's *Naming of Departmental Assets Procedure* (the Procedure) were shared and attendees were asked to nominate options for the school name.
- 11. On 23 June naming surveys were sent to Raceview SS, Amberley District SS and Deebing Heights SS and asked to be placed on their school websites and Facebook pages and notices of community consultations placed in their school newsletters. Survey forms were also sent to the Providence Community Hub, and Minka Place at Eco Ripley and advertised via their internal and extended newsletters and Facebook pages. 



SUBJECT: NAMING OF THE NEW SECONDARY SCHOOL LOCATED AT 18 PARKWAY AVENUE, SOUTH RIPLEY, QLD, 4306.

Summary of key objectives

- To seek the Minister's approval to officially name the new state primary school located on Parkway Avenue, South Ripley, scheduled to open on 28 January 2020, as Ripley Valley State Secondary College.
- To request the Minister sign the letter to the Honourable Annastacia Palaszczuk MP, Premier and Minister for Trade, advising about the proposed name for the school and seeking urgent advice by 11 September 2019, if there are any concerns with the proposed name (Attachment 1).
- To request the Minister sign the letters to be sent on 11 September 2019, provided the Premier has not raised any concerns about the proposed name to:
 - Mr Brendan Krueger, Principal (Attachment 2);
 - Interim Administrator Mr Greg Chemello, City of Ipswich (Attachment 3);
 - Mrs Jo-Ann Miller, Member for Bundamba (Attachment 4); and
 - Shayne Neumann MP, Member for Blair (Attachment 5).

Key issues

- 1. Approval of the school name is required to progress establishment of enrolments, uniforms, logos, bank accounts, official domain and websites, school signage and advertising campaigns.
- 2. A public announcement of the school name will allow for enrolment processes to commence, ensuring the school opens with a strong student enrolment on the first day of Term 1, 2020.
- 3. Mr Brendan Krueger has been appointed as the Principal of the new state secondary school.
- 4. There are no other Queensland schools where there may be a conflict with regard to the proposed name of Ripley Valley State Secondary College .
- 5. Mr Brendan Krueger commenced community consultation regarding the naming of the new school in June 2019.
- 6. Mr Brendan Krueger has consulted with State and Federal Members of Parliament regarding the proposed name. The Local Council is currently under administration and was unable to participate in this process.

- 7. Throughout the consultation, Mr Brendan Krueger communicated with State and Federal Members of Parliament, principals of local primary schools and high schools, parents/carers of prospective students from local primary schools, parents/carers of prospective students living within the proposed 2020 school catchment area, local businesses, and local community members.
- 8. Mr Brendan Krueger liaised with members of the Metropolitan Region's Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander team, local Indigenous Elders and the Ipswich City Council's Indigenous development officer regarding the naming suggestions.
- 9. A temporary school Facebook page and website has been established with regular communication with the school community occurring
- 10. On 30 June 2019, approximately 80 people attended the Community Information and Consultation evening held at Providence Community Hall. On 31 June 2019 approximately 50 people attended the Community Information and Consultation at Minka Place in Eco Ripley. On the 8 August 2019 approximately 100 people attended the Community Information and Consultation evening held at Deebing Heights State School. Requirements of the department's *Naming of Departmental Assets Procedure* (the Procedure) were shared and attendees were asked to nominate options for the school name.
- 11. On 23 June 2019 naming surveys were sent to Raceview State School, Amberley District State School and Deebing Heights State School and asked that they were shared with their school communities via school websites and Facebook pages and that notices of community consultations placed in their school newsletters. Survey forms were also sent to the Providence Community Hub, and Minka Place at Eco Ripley and advertised via their internal and extended newsletters and Facebook pages. The survey was also available on the High school temporary facebook page for community input.
- 12. Three names were proposed and on 13 August 2019 the three most popular options were surveyed for feedback via paper and online survey. An online SurveyMonkey was conducted from 13 August 2019 to 23 August 2019 via the new school temporary Facebook Page, neaby schools Facebook pages and newsletters and a hard copy version available for Community Information and Consultation meetings.
- 13. The SurveyMonkey results showed that 64% of 961 respondents prefered Ripley Valley as the prefix name for the secondary school, and that out of this 64% of respondents 32.78% preferred State High School, compared to 31.22% who preferred State Secondary College. Due to the close nature of the school suffix name, the feedback results were discussed in detail with the Community Advisory Committee on the 27/08/2019. As a result of this meeting and subsequent discussion the Community Advisory Committee unanimously recommends that the new school be named Ripley Valley State Secondary College (Attachment 6)
- 14. A letter has been drafted for the Minister to sign, seeking agreement from the Premier to name the new high school at South Ripley, "Ripley Valley State Secondary College ".
- 15. The Office of the Deputy Director-General, Corporate Services, has consulted with the Department of the Premier and Cabinet regarding consultation with the Premier's Office who support the approach proposed in the letter to the Premier provided at **Attachment 1**.

Media implications and opportunities

16. A media release will be drafted by Strategic Community and Engagement to announce the name of the school, should the Premier endorse the Minister approve the proposed name of Ripley Valley State Secondary College

Financial implications

17. The cost of branding Ripley Valley State Secondary College will be met from the school's operational budget.

Legal implications

18. Under section 16 of the *Education (General Provisions) Act 2006*, the Minister may name, and change the name, of a state educational institution. There are no associated legal implications.

Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander impacts

19. The Indigenous Elders of the local region were consulted and there are no impacts.

Background

- 20. The new secondary school at South Ripley is in Stage 1 of construction and is one of eight new schools to open across Queensland in 2020. The new school is purpose built to accommodate Year 7 to 12 students.
- 21. The school will open in 2020 for Year 7 & 8 students with an anticipated enrolment of 120 students.
- 22. In accordance with the Procedure, school names should promote the school's location or identity while reflecting local and community sensibilities. Appropriate names may include:
 - locality or other local names of geographical significance, for example 'Glasshouse Mountains';
 - names of local flora or fauna;
 - local Indigenous names; or
 - marking cultural or heritage significance.
- 23. The school is located on Parkway Avenue, South Ripley: Lot No. 8000 Survey Plan 292804 (Title reference 51158562) and adjoins the new primary school located in South Ripley. Following the community consultation process and school naming survey responses it is proposed that the two new schools should share the first part of their respective school names, e.g Ripley Valley.
- 24. Ripley Valley is used by local residents, business owners and community to describe the larger community area within this lpswich corridor.
- 25. Ripley Valley State Secondary College satisfies the protocols required when determining a name for a built asset belonging to the department.

Good Morning Shayne,

Thank you for your feedback and input into the proposed name for the new secondary school in Ripley Valley. I have attached two documents for your information that I have used in preparing my naming brief for proposed new high school in Ripley.

The survey results (Attachment 1) show the overall survey feedback results from 961 respondents who provided feedback.

The survey indicated that the majority of respondents were in overwhelming support for the prefix school name to be Ripley Valley, while the suffix name was extremely close with a 1% difference between "State High School" and "State Secondary College".

As a result of this close result, the feedback results were presented to the Community Advisory Committee who have been meeting weekly since early August to provide clarity and a recommendation on behalf of the community for the future name of the school. Following this discussion the Community Advisory Committee have unanimously recommended that the new high school be called "Ripley Valley State Secondary College" and they have provided a letter of recommendation to this effect (attachment 6 above).

Key issues

- Throughout the consultation, Mrs Meerwald and Mr Krueger also communicated with State and Federal Members of Parliament, principals of local primary schools and high schools, parents/carers of prospective students from local primary schools, parents/carers of prospective students living within the proposed 2020 school catchment areas. local businesses, and local community members.
- Mrs Meerwald and Mr Krueger liaised with members of the Metropolitan Regional Office's Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Education team, local Indigenous Elders and the Ipswich City Council's Indigenous Development Officer regarding the naming suggestions.
- 10. A—<u>T</u>temporary school Facebook pages haves been established with regular communication with the school community occurring.
- 11. On 23 June 2019, a survey for name suggestions wasnaming surveys were sent to Raceview State School, Amberley District State School and Deebing Heights State School and asked that they were shared with their school communities via school websites and Facebook pages and that notices of community consultations be placed in their school newsletters. Survey forms were also sent to the Providence Community Hub and Minke Place at Eco Ripley and advertised through their internal and extended newsletters and Facebook pages. The surveys were also available on the new primary and secondary school's' temporary Facebook pages for community input.
- 12. On 30 June 2019, approximately 80 people attended the community information and consultation evening held at Providence Community Hall.
- 13. On 31 June 2019, approximately 50 people attended the community information and consultation evening at held Minka Place in Eco Ripley.
- 14. On the 8 August 2019, approximately 100 people attended the community information and consultation evening held at Deebing Heights State School.
- 15. During these information sessions, requirements of the Department of Education's Naming of Departmental Assets procedure were shared and attendees were asked to nominate options for the school names.
- 16. While the Naming of Departmental Assets procedure does not explicitly include the use of the word 'college' in a primary context, there are other precedents for this, including Talara Primary College (P-6) and Pimpama State Primary College, and a number of other schools that do not offer Prep to Year 12 yet have the word 'college' in their name.
- 17. Given the preference for the neighbouring new secondary school to be named Ripley Valley State Secondary College and to assist in consistency of naming and branding to the community, it is proposed to name the primary school Ripley Valley State Primary College. This would result in the two new state schools presenting a united front to this emerging community.
- 18. On 13 August 2019, Mrs Meerwald and Mr Krueger identified the three most popular prefix name suggestions Ripley Valley, South Ripley and Ripley. An online and hardcopy survey was conducted from 13 August 2019 to 23 August 2019 through the new school's' temporary Facebook pages, nearby schools' Facebook pages and newsletters.
- 19. There were 947 responses to the primary school survey with the following results:
 - Ripley Valley 65.26%;
 - South Ripley 24.6%; and
 - ——Ripley 10.14%.

20. There were 961 responses to the secondary school survey, with 64% favouring Ripley Valley as the prefix name for the secondary school, and that from this result, 32.78% preferred State High School and 31.22% preferred State Secondary College. Page 4 of 5

20.21. Due to the close result for the secondary school suffix name, the feedback results were discussed in detail with the Community Advisory Committee on 27 August 2019. As a result of this meeting and subsequent discussion, the Community Advisory Committee unanimously recommended the name of the new secondary school be named Ripley Valley State Secondary College (Attachment 7).

Media implications and opportunities

21.22. A media release will be drafted by Strategic Community and Engagement to announce the name of the schools, should the Premier endorse and the Minister approve the proposed names of Ripley Valley State Primary College_and_Ripley Valley State Secondary College.-

Financial implications

22.23. The cost of branding Ripley Valley State Primary Coilege and <u>Ripley Valley State</u> <u>Secondary College</u> will be met from the school's' operational budgets.

Legal implications

23.24. Under section 16 of the Education (General Provisions) Act 2006, the Minister may name, and change the name, of a state educational institution. There are no associated legal implications.

24-25. The Indigenous Elders of the local region were consulted and there have been no Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander impacts identified.

Summary of key objectives

- To seek the Minister's approval to officially name the new state primary school located on Botany Drive, South Ripley, scheduled to open on 28 January 2020, as Ripley Valley State Primary College.
- To seek the Minister's approval to officially name the new state secondary school located on Parkway Avenue, South Ripley, scheduled to open on 28 January 2020, as Ripley Valley State Secondary College.
- To request the Minister sign the letter to the Honourable Annastacia Palaszczuk MP, Premier and Minister for Trade, advising the proposed names for the schools and seeking urgent advice by 24 September 2019, if there are any concerns with the proposed names (Attachment 1).
- To request the Minister sign letters to be sent on 30 September 2019, provided the Premier has not raised any concerns about the proposed names, to:
 - Mrs Naomi Meerwald, Principal, Ripley Valley State Primary College (Attachment 2);
 - Mr Brendan Krueger, Principal, Ripley Valley State Secondary College (Attachment 3);
 - Mr Greg Chemello, Interim Administrator, City of Ipswich (Attachment 4);
 - Mrs Jo-Ann Miller MP, Member for Bundamba (Attachment 5); and

Key issues

- 1. Approval of the school names is required to progress establishment of enrolments, uniforms, logos, bank accounts, official domain and websites, school signage and advertising campaigns.
- 2. A public announcement of the school names will allow enrolment processes to commence, ensuring the schools open with strong student enrolments on the first day of Term 1, 2020.
- 3. Mrs Meerwald has been appointed as the Principal of the new state primary school.
- 4. Mr Krueger has been appointed as the Principal of the new state secondary college.
- 5. There are no other Queensland schools where there may be a conflict with regard to the proposed name of Ripley Valley State Primary College or Ripley Valley State Secondary College.
- 6. Mrs Meerwald and Mr Kreuger commenced community consultation regarding the naming of the new schools in June 2019.
- 7. Mrs Meerwald and Mr Kreuger consulted with State and Federal Members of Parliament regarding the proposed names. The Local Council is currently under administration and was unable to participate in this process.

Throughout the consultation, Mrs Meerwald and Mr Krueger also communicated with State and Federal Members of Parliament, principals of local primary schools and high schools, parents/carers of prospective students from local primary schools, parents/carers of prospective students living within the proposed 2020 school catchment areas, local businesses, and local community members.

- Mrs Meerwald and Mr Krueger liaised with members of the Metropolitan Regional Office's Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Education team, local Indigenous Elders and the Ipswich City Council's Indigenous Development Officer regarding the naming suggestions.
- 10. Temporary school Facebook pages have been established with regular communication with the school community occurring.
- 11. On 23 June 2019, naming surveys were sent to Raceview State School, Amberley District State School and Deebing Heights State School and asked that they were shared with their school communities via school websites and Facebook pages and that notices of community consultations be placed in their school newsletters. Survey forms were also sent to the Providence Community Hub and Minka Place at Eco Ripley and advertised through their internal and extended newsletters and Facebook pages. The surveys were also available on the new primary and secondary schools' temporary Facebook pages for community input.
- 12. On 30 June 2019, approximately 80 people attended the community information and consultation evening held at Providence Community Hall.
- 13. On 31 June 2019, approximately 50 people attended the community information and consultation evening at held Minka Place in Eco Ripley.
- 14. On 8 August 2019, approximately 100 people attended the community information and consultation evening held at Deebing Heights State School.
- 15. During these information sessions, requirements of the Department of Education's *Naming* of *Departmental Assets* procedure were shared and attendees were asked to nominate options for the school names.
- 16. While the Naming of Departmental Assets procedure does not explicitly include the use of the word 'college' in a primary context, there are other precedents for this, including Talara Primary College (P–6) and Pimpama State Primary College, and a number of other schools that do not offer Prep to Year 12 yet have the word 'college' in their name.
- 17. Given the preference for the neighbouring new secondary school to be named Ripley Valley State Secondary College and to assist in consistency of naming and branding to the community, it is proposed to name the primary school Ripley Valley State Primary College. This would result in the two new state schools presenting a united front to this emerging community.
- 18. On 13 August 2019, Mrs Meerwald and Mr Krueger identified the three most popular prefix name suggestions Ripley Valley, South Ripley and Ripley. An online and hardcopy survey was conducted from 13 August 2019 to 23 August 2019 through the new schools' temporary Facebook pages, nearby schools' Facebook pages and newsletters.
- 19. There were 947 responses to the primary school survey with the following results:
 - Ripley Valley 65.26%;
 - South Ripley 24.6%; and
 - Ripley 10.14%.
- 20. There were 961 responses to the secondary school survey, with 64% favouring Ripley Valley as the prefix name for the secondary school, and that from this result, 32.78% preferred State High School and 31.22% preferred State Secondary College.

21. Due to the close result for the secondary school suffix name, the feedback results were discussed in detail with the Community Advisory Committee on 27 August 2019. As a result of this meeting and subsequent discussion, the Community Advisory Committee unanimously recommended the name of the new secondary school be named Ripley Valley State Secondary College (Attachment 7).

Media implications and opportunities

22. A media release will be drafted by Strategic Community and Engagement to announce the name of the schools, should the Premier endorse and the Minister approve the proposed names of Ripley Valley State Primary College and Ripley Valley State Secondary College.

Financial implications

23. The cost of branding Ripley Valley State Primary College and Ripley Valley State Secondary College will be met from the schools' operational budgets.

Legal implications

24. Under section 16 of the *Education (General Provisions) Act 2006*, the Minister may name, and change the name, of a state educational institution. There are no associated legal implications.



Key issues

- 8. Mr Krueger liaised with members of the Metropolitan Regional Office's Acoriginal and Torres Strait Islander Education team, local Indigenous Elders and the Ipswich City Council's Indigenous Development Officer regarding the naming suggestions.
- 9. A temporary school Facebook page and website has been established with regular communication with the school community occurring.
- 10. On 23 June 2019, naming surveys were sent to Raceview State School, Amberley District State School and Deebing Heights State School and asked that they were shared with their school communities via school websites and Facebook pages and that notices of community consultation be placed in their school newsletters. Survey forms were also sent to the Providence Community Hub and Minka Place at Eco Ripley and advertised through their internal and extended newsletters and Facebook pages. The survey was also available on the new secondary school's temporary Facebook page for community input.
- 11. On 30 June 2019, approximately 80 people attended the community information and consultation evening held at Providence Community Hall.
- 12. On 31 June 2019, approximately 50 people attended the community information and consultation evening at Minka Place in Eco Ripley.
- 13. On the 8 August 2019, approximately 100 people attended the community information and consultation evening held at Deebing Heights State School.
- 14. During these information sessions, requirements of the Department of Education's *Naming* of *Departmental Assets* procedure were shared and attendees were asked to nominate options for the school name.
- 15. On 13 August 2019, the Principal identified the three most popular prefix name suggestions Ripley Valley, Ripley and South Ripley. An online and hardcopy survey was conducted from 13 to 23 August 2019 through the new secondary school temporary Facebook page and nearby schools' Facebook pages and newsletters.
- 16. There were 961 responses with 64% favouring Ripley Valley as the prefix name for the secondary school, and that from this result, 32.78% preferred State High School and 31.22% preferred State Secondary College.
- 17. Due to the close result for the school suffix name, the feedback results were discussed in detail with the Community Advisory Committee on 27 August 2019. As a result of this meeting and subsequent discussion, the Community Advisory Committee unanimously recommended the name of the new secondary school be named Ripley Valley State Secondary College (Attachment 6).

Media implications and opportunities

- 24. The new secondary school at South Ripley is in Stage 1 of construction and is one of eight new schools to open across Queensland in 2020. The new school is purpose built to accommodate Year 7 to 12 students.
- 25. The school will open in 2020 for Year 7 & 8 students with an anticipated enrolment of 120 students.
- 26. In accordance with the department's *Naming of Departmental Assets Procedure*, school names should promote the school's location or identity while reflecting local and community sensibilities. Appropriate names may include:
 - locality or other local names of geographical significance, for example 'Glasshouse Mountains';
 - names of local flora or fauna;
 - local Indigenous names; or
 - marking cultural or heritage significance.
- 27. The school is located on Parkway Avenue, South Ripley and adjoins the new primary school located in South Ripley. Following the community consultation process and school naming survey responses, it is proposed that the two new schools should share the first part of their respective school names, e.g. Ripley Valley.
- 28. Ripley Valley is used by local residents, business owners and community to describe the larger community area within this Ipswich corridor.
- 29. Ripley Valley State Secondary College satisfies the protocols required when determining a name for a built asset belonging to the department.

Recommendation

That the Minister:

- approve the name Ripley Valley State Secondary College as the official name for the new secondary school to be opened on the corner of Parkway Avenue and Providence Parade, South Ripley on 28 January 2020;
- sign the letter to the Honourable Annastacia Palaszczuk MP, Premier and Minister for Trade, advising about the proposed name for the school and seeking urgent advice by 13 September 2019, if there are any concerns with the proposed name (Attachment 1); and
- sign the letters to be sent on 13 September 2019, provided the Premier has not raised any concerns about the proposed name, to:
 - Mr Brendan Krueger, Principal (Attachment 2);
 - Interim Administrator Mr Greg Chemelio, City of Ipswich (Attachment 3);
 - Mrs Jo-Ann Miller, Member for Bundamba (Attachment 4); and
 - Mr Shayne Neumann MP, Member for Blair (Attachment 5).
