Audits are still underway but it's my understanding that once all the schools included in this announcement are air-conditioned, more than two thirds of all Queensland schools will have air-conditioning in every classroom.

I want to also acknowledge the fantastic work already done by P&Cs and school communities in the past to provide air-conditioning in schools.

However, this additional government funding will now allow us to build on that great work and continue our measured and fiscally-responsible approach while others make unbudgeted promises that could cost billions.
