## **Briefing Note**

Routine – Ministerial approval is sought for the dissolution of the Queensland Schools Planning Commission (QSPC) and information provided regarding the future cross-sectoral school planning consultation process.

SUBJECT: THE DISSOLUTION OF THE QUEENSLAND SCHOOLS PLANNING COMMISSION AND FUTURE CROSS-SECTORAL SCHOOL PLANNING

CONSULTATION

#### Summary of key objectives

- To seek the Minister's approval for dissolution of the Queensland Schools Planning Commission (QSPC), in line with recommendations in the QSPC's July 2014 report.
- To provide information regarding the continuation of cross-sectoral school planning activities following the dissolution of the QSPC.
- To provide information regarding the proposed formation of the Queensland Schools Planning Reference Committee (QSPRC) and bi-annual Schools Planning Forums.
- To seek the Minister's signature on the notification letters to the QSPC Chair (Attachment 3) and Members (Attachment 4).

#### Key issues

- One of the QSPC's purposes under its Terms of Reference (TOR) was to initiate a
  process of mapping and publishing the projected future need for new school services. It
  is recommended that this process continue following the dissolution of QSPC, to ensure
  that published findings remain up-to-date with changes in local circumstances and the
  latest population projections.
- 2. The consultation undertaken by QSPC involved a series of meetings with all relevant stakeholders. These stakeholders included representatives from the Department of Education and Training (DET), local governments, the Queensland Catholic Education Commission, Independent Schools Queensland, and the Queensland Government Statistician's Office. A mix of state-wide and local representatives typically attended from these organisations.
- 3. The meetings involved structured consultation covering all of the suburbs, neighbourhoods and towns where growth was projected to occur, including discussion of all available statistical and local information about projected growth in school-aged children, and the school facilities (across the state and non-state sectors) that will be required to meet the projected demand. Consensus from all stakeholders was achieved on the recommendations during the meetings.
- In its July 2014 report, the QSPC advised it had delivered on its TOR and recommended that:
  - the QSPC be dissolved;
  - there should be ongoing consultation regarding future demand mapping; and
  - future demand mapping should be performed by DET in collaboration with key stakeholders.

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5. The Minister has noted a Department brief which recommended the dissolution of the QSPC and for future demand mapping to be performed by DET but requested an alternative approach.

Ongoing consultation is also strongly supported by all stakeholders and the non-state sector and they are eager for consultation to continue. The current round of consultation with stakeholders is approximately 70% complete.

7. It is therefore proposed that, following dissolution of the QSPC, consultation processes 'continue with key stakeholders and that this stakeholder body is known as the QSPRC. A draft TOR for the proposed committee has been prepared for review and formal endorsement by QSPRC members (Attachment 1).

Reference Commutes

- 8. As outlined in the draft QSPRC TOR, the primary purpose of the committee is to establish and maintain a consultative, cross-sector process to:
  - assess the impact of population growth and to inform the planning of new schools in Queensland;
  - provide advice to Government on general issues relating to the planning of new schools, and possible reforms to assist in the timely collaborative and efficient delivery of educational infrastructure for growth areas; and
  - enable key stakeholders to consider issues relating to planning for new schools.
- Membership of the proposed QSPRC includes representation from the following organisations:
  - Department of Education and Training;
  - Queensland Catholic Education Commission;
  - Brisbane Catholic Education Office:
  - Independent Schools Queensland;
  - Local Government Association of Queensland; and
  - Queensland Government Statistician's Office.
- 10. The former QSPC stakeholders have also recommended that the QSPRC would be an ideal body to support discussion and advancement of ideas about general schools planning issues. In this capacity, the QSPRC could make recommendations to Government on general issues relating to the planning of new schools, and possible reforms to assist in the timely, collaborative and efficient delivery of educational infrastructure for growth areas.

11. It is further proposed that the QSPRC will hold twice yearly forums (the Schools Planning Forum) with key representatives to discuss issues pertaining to planning for new schools. A proposed list of attendees for these forums is outlined in Attachment 2.

12. The recommendations identified during QSPRC consultation meetings will be presented at the bi-annual Schools Planning Forums for endorsement, prior to submission to the Minister for approval and publication.

#### Media Implications

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13. The work undertaken by the Queensland Schools Planning committees is of interest to the community and media.

#### Financial Implications

- 14. The funds that were originally committed for the operation of the QSPC will no longer be available following its dissolution.
- 15. The scope of activities outlined in this brief may have resourcing implications for Infrastructure Services Branch.

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#### Background

- On 24 July 2012, the QSPC was established as a Ministerial Advisory Committee with a budget of \$4 million over three years (ending on 30 June 2015).
- 17. The QSPC was established to:
  - streamline and coordinate processes for the planning, establishment and expansion of government and non-government schools;
  - consider population trends and school capacity to guide future planning; and
  - examine school infrastructure planning systems and recommend ways to increase their efficiency and cut red tape.
- 18. The QSPC provided two formal reports to the former Minister for Education, Training and Employment in July 2013 and July 2014, and presented additional demand mapping in November 2013 and infrastructure charging recommendations in January 2014. This work included the completion of a 20-year state-wide demand map and a more detailed analysis of the top 30 high-growth areas across the state. Across these 30 areas, there is a cumulative projected need for up to 83 new primary schools and up to 36 new secondary schools prior to 2031.

## Right to information

19. I am of the view that the contents or attachments contained in this brief are suitable for publication.

#### Recommendation

That the Minister:

- approve the dissolution of the Queensland Schools Planning Commission;
- note the proposed arrangements for the continuation of cross-sectoral school planning consultation activities following dissolution of the Queensland Schools Planning Commission;
- endorse the establishment of the Queensland Schools Planning Reference Committee to continue cross-sectoral collaboration on future school planning; and
- sign notification letters to the Queensland Schools Planning Commission Chair (Attachment 3) and Members (Attachment 4).

The following may be attributed to a spokesperson for the Department of Education:

Queensland is a growth state and state schools continue to experience enrolment growth at around 1.6% (or some 8000 students) per annum.

The Queensland Government is investing record funding in state school infrastructure with around \$1 billion being invested to expand, enhance, renew and maintain our state schools.

We want every student to attend their local state school.

All local students are entitled to attend their local state school and the department will always make sure that there is sufficient room for students to receive a quality education.

Over 500 Queensland state schools are subject to an Enrolment Management Plan that assist in managing local enrolment demand.

State Schools must prioritise local, in catchment students, ahead of out-of-catchment students.

The capacity of a school is determined by both the physical capacity of the infrastructure available and the manner in which the school operates its curriculum delivery in those classrooms.

Capacity figures are subject to change as new or changed infrastructure or curriculum programs are delivered.

Enrolments may fluctuate throughout the year and the department responds to changing need.

The department provides additional infrastructure where required for in-catchment enrolment growth.

The department uses two student enrolment capacity measures – Student Enrolment Capacity and Built Enrolment Capacity

The Built Enrolment Capacity is the maximum number of students that can be accommodated within the state school infrastructure provided at a local level.

Schools reference the School Errolment Capacity in their enrolment management plans to assist in managing enrolments, particularly out of catchment enrolments to ensure that there is sufficient capacity for local students to enrol. This enables the school to manage enrolments within the Built Enrolment Capacity of the school and supports medium to long term enrolment management.

The Courier Mail story has referenced the Student Enrolment Capacity which is a lower figure than the Built Enrolment Capacity. The attached table provides the Built Enrolment Capacity of the schools listed.

Dear All

Ex-Tropical cyclone Ann has been reclassified as a tropical low.

The system may still produce severe weather along the north and far-north Queensland coast on Wednesday 15 May 2019.

Although the system has been re-classified as a tropical low, there is still the potential for strong winds to the southern flank of the system as it reaches the coast on Wednesday.

These may affect the coast and adjacent inland areas between Lockhart River and Cooktown, including Lizard Island, on Wednesday morning.
