





Of course students and teachers are a part of the School, but I like to think our Parents and Citizens Association - past and present - have contributed to making Rosedale School what it is.


I will close by thanking all who have given time and effort towards the organising of this centenary celebration and we look forward to the 13th July, 1996, as your reward.



- The Little family, first settlers of Rosedale, set out from Bathurst in 1851, with 2,000 sheep, 100 head of cattle and a number of horses. They arrived here on 14th July, 1853. Their selection comprised of three 25 square mile blocks ~ on a 40 year lease.
- The name "Rosedale" was selected by Mrs. Little. Her husband was writing his first letter after settling in the district and asked her what address he should give. She simply answered "Rosedale".
- Until 1859 wool was sent to Maryborough by wagon, provisions being brought back on the return journey — which often took two months for the round trip. Their provisions included flour (purchased by the ton) and a chest of tea and rice. Later on Mr. Little chartered the "Albion", a small steamer, to bring rations and take the wool to market in Sydney. It berthed in Baffle Creek each year.
- The maximum number of sheep run at Rosedale was 10,000, however, a series of wet years proved the country unsuitable for sheep, the sheep were subsequently moved to land on the Dawson and cattle were run on "Rosedale".
- Aboriginals were numerous in the area but usually confined their depredation's to sheep stealing and cattle spearing. After several unprecedented attacks on shepherds, the whites were forced to drive the tribe out of the district ~ an unfortunate incident in the history of this area. (It became known as the Littabella massacre).
- During their journey north, they camped on a creek near what is now Rosedale. That night they consumed a bottle of rum and put the empty bottle in the fork of a tree and called the creek "Bottle Creek".
- It was not until 1895 that the first steam train pulled into Rosedale and for some time there were two trains a week from the South. It was two years later before the line was completed through to Gladstone. With the line came the first butcher shop in Rosedale, owned by Mr. Leabon and also the surveying of blocks used for dairying, growing of com, English potatoes and other vegetables.



RUSEDALE STATE SCOUL SISTURY

Rosedale School started as a provisional school in 1896 after much negotiation with the Department of Education. A building committee constructed the school opposite the railway station on a school reserve of ten acres which had previously belonged to Elizabeth Mc Cann and was donated by Henry Mc Cann (owner of the first hotel) for 94 pounds. The first teacher, Thomas Butler, opened the school on the 6th July but had no furniture. The enrolment by September was 53 students but the average attendance was below 30. In 1905 District Inspector O. Radcliffe described the building as "one of the largest and most commodious of the provisional school buildings in the district". In 1964 the Department decided to put a school transport service to Rosedale.

A play shed was erected at Rosedale School in 1907 and it became a State School in 1909. In 1912 the school was provided with a ceiling, a back verandah and was repainted. Water closets were provided with strong locks to stop men camping at the water-hole not far from the School, using them at night. The School residence was built in 1933. In 1935 a new School was built by the Department with two school rooms and verandahs on three sides. The new building was due for opening on the 25th January, 1936, but was postponed to the 4th February after the funeral of King George V. The old School was sold for removal to nurseryman C. C. Langbecker. A secondary department was added to the School in 1964 with an enrolment of twenty one students. Before this, high school children from Bororen southwards would make the journey to high schools in Bundaberg each day by rail motor. The rail motor left Bororen at 5:30, reaching Bundaberg at 8:50. Homework was completed on the return journey. There has been a Sturat family member at Rosedale School from the time of Claude Stirrat in 1921.

1926 - In April it was decided to hold a dance for the School on a Saturday nearest the full moon. The price was 2/- single and 3/- double and the raffle was a pair of hens donated by a Mr. Watson.

In September a concert and dance was held to raise money for a tennis court. One hundred and fifteen yards of wire netting was purchased at two pounds from Mr. Wills. The court was completed by 1927.

- 1928 In May swabs were taken at School for carriers of diphtheria. The School was furnigated in the Christmas holidays.
- 1929 On the 3rd August letters were written to arrange the first inter-school sports.

 Schools from Mullet Creek to Karina were invited to Rosedale.
- 1932 Due to the School having 62 pupils, Miss E. Courtice was appointed first Assistant Teacher. The Basketball Court was also built.
- 1933 On the 4th February the first cricket wicket was made from cement.
- 1956 Marjorie Lloyd-Jones was the first student to complete her schooling at Rosedale and she then returned as a teacher.

In November Ron Neumann was presented with a special prize for six years of continuous schooling without missing a day.

- 1958 On the 17th June, Terry McLellan represented Queensland in Primary Tennis in Sydney.
 He later won the under 16 Queensland Titles in May 1960.
- 1959 On the 11 July the Golden Jubilee Celebrations were held. Mr K. Wills was asked to plant a tree for Labour Day as he was an original pupil for the Jubilee year.
- 1966 In July the school obtained its first piano which was purchased with the proceeds from the concert which was held.
 - In September it was the first Official Opening of the Secondary Department Wing.
- 1971 The school uniform was introduced The colours were a Blue Tunic and Gold Cord around the waist with White shoes.
- 1973 In April the oval was opened.
- 1975 On 04 October twelve trees were planted and a fete was held for the Centenary of State Education.
 - The septic toilets were also built in this year and the first Janitor Groundsman was appointed.
- 1977 A metal Adventure Playground was constructed.
- 1979 On 24 November the Manual Arts/Home Economics block was built.
- 1980 The Tuckshop and Early Childhood centre was opened and a timber Adventure Playground was supplied.
- 1982 The Adventure Playground was improved.
- 1983 Married teacher accommodation was built and a Cricket practice wicket was constructed.
- 1984 A new Primary Double Teaching Space and covered games area was built.
- 1987 Tennis Court was built and a Science Laboratory and Demountable building was introduced to cater for the Years 11 and 12
- 1988 The Library was opened.
- 1993 An Administration Block was built and opened.
- 1995 The new Preschool and a double storey Home Economics/Manual Arts block was constructed. Previous Home Economics room reconstructed into Science Laboratory
- 1996 The new Primary double teaching space was opened





STATE SCHOOL, ROSEDALE

The School was opened as a Provisional School on 6th July, 1896, and became a State School on 1st January, 1909.

A Secondary Department was attached to the School as from 1st January, 1964, with an enrolment of 21 students.



MEMORIES OF ROSEDALE

by Des James (Assistant Teacher) with Mr George Beverley

January to August 1952

At twenty years of age, I was appointed from Teachers Training College in Brisbane.

I boarded with Mr & Mrs Jack McPherson. They were extremely kind. Board was thirty shillings a week.

I taught twelve Grade 1 and eleven Grade 2 children. Mr Beverley taught the remaining forty children in Grades 3 to 7.

Mr Beverly was an outstanding identity who helped me a great deal. Mrs Beverley played the violin and piano for folk dancing. Their lovely daughter Joan aged about eight could not hear but her accomplishments were amazing.

I visited George and Mrs Beverley at Carina in Brisbane in about 1979 after he retired. I was, by then, Principal of a large Primary School in Brisbane. George passed away some years ago and Mrs Beverley, also, not too many years after him. In 1979 Joan was married and lived in Brisbane.

I fancied myself as a "good" tennis player. Not long after I arrived Stan Bryce kindly offered to have a game of singles with me. After chipping the court and marking out some lines with lime from a tin can we commenced what I though would be some second rate practice. Stan trounced me (the fancy pantz young city slicker) 6-1, 6-0. I was truly humbled and have never recovered from this first rate "lesson". After this match Stan and I became good mates enjoying many more tough tennis encounters.

During my seven months stay in Rosedale the new RSL Hall was built.

The local publican (name forgotten) casually threw a well used tea towel over a "warm" jug of beer which sat ceremoniously on the village bar, until the next customer requested a refill.

Local folk gathered at the CWA Rest Rooms each Wednesday evening for a Euchre Tournament.

"The Rocky Mail Train" passed through Rosedale at approximately 6pm. It stopped at the station for approximately twenty minutes to allow passengers to buy beverages and food from the refreshment rooms. A social event for local folk was to wander down and sit on the platform seats and be part of this busy atmosphere.

Mr Jack McPherson took me on a ten mile horse ride to a property he once owned at Diamond Hill. He laughed because I was "saddle sore" for days after.

The local Police Sergeant, had a daughter in my Grade One. She was sometimes disobedient and I scolded her severely on a number of occasions. One day the Sergeant came walking up the school steps near my classroom in full uniform. He was a large man. When he appeared I feared that I was going to be "physically" dealt with or otherwise legally reprimanded for being unkind to his little daughter. His visit however was to converse about a truant family with the Head Teacher - Mr Beverley. My fear was genuine and to this day I have a very healthy respect for large country Police Sergeants.

From Rosedale I became a Head Teacher of a small one teacher school at Bingera South. (9 children), and then moved "up the ladder" to Pampus, Burncluith, Coulson, Mount Beppo, Drillham, Capella Miles and Principal of Brisbane Schools, Alexandra Hills, Marshall Road, Thornlands and Camira.

After studying externally with the University of Queensland I graduated in 1972. I retired in 1988 after 37 years.

Rosedale was a wonderful place. I have always cherished the relationships I established with local folk for whom I have a very high respect and affection. They taught that young teacher fellow a great deal, in a very few months.

If I have been successful in passing on at least some of those excellent attitudes and values, which I acquired at Rosedale, to the thousands of children, and hundreds of teachers I've had under my care, then I'm indebted to those really fine Rosedale people.



REFLECTIONS OF THE CHANGES IN THE EDUCATION SYSTEM OVER THE PAST 75 YEARS

My first association with the Rosedale State School was in January, 1921, when I commenced my schooling at the age of five years and three months. Being the only new enrolment that year, it placed me in the unique position of being top and bottom of the class at the same time. At that time there was only a low set one room building with an open front verandah and a back verandah with a partly enclosed area at each end for the children's hats and school bags to be hung on pegs.

The grounds were very stony and as practically all the pupils went to school bare footed there were plenty of stone bruises and injured feet (including my own). Quite a vast difference with the thirteen modern buildings including the Arts, Manual Arts and Home Economics buildings erected on the grounds, also the grounds have been top dressed and a beautiful sports oval and a top class tennis court with an overall value for buildings, ground improvement and sporting facilities and education equipment that could exceed well over one million dollars.

The enrolment at that time would be about 35 pupils with only a gradual increase until the early 1930's. The teacher having from six to eight classes to teach, as a result, to ease the work load different pupils in class five were called upon to teach the first and second classes tables and spelling on the front verandah, which was very cold in the winter winds. The enrolments gradually increased and by the early 1930's there were between forty-five and sixty pupils and the first assistant teacher, Miss Essie Courtice, was appointed to the School. The classes ranged from one to five with eighteen months spent in each class and was referred to as first, second and third half year. The compulsory leaving age was fourteen years at which time the pupils would have completed their fifth class standard.

Only about 2% of the pupils had the opportunity to continue on to secondary education. This is in vast contrast to the present day where classes have been abandoned and replaced with grades from one to seven and with eight grade commencing their first year of secondary school and continuing on to twelfth grade which is senior standard. Over the years many of the students after completing senior have been successful in obtaining important positions in business and industry in the Bundaberg region and other cities.

Due to the increase in numbers of pupils by the early 1960's a local committee of parents and concerned citizens decided to make an approach to the Education Department for a secondary hightop to be established at the School. As a result, a deputation with a submission was lead by Mr. Claude Wharton, then Minister for Works and Housing to meet Mr. Jack Pizzy, who was then Education Minister. Following the excellent submission presented, Mr. Pizzy gave his approval for a Hightop Department commencing with one secondary teacher who was Mr. Rob Halloran, who obtained excellent results in the first year.

When the Watalgan, Mullett Creek, Berajondo and Baffle Creek Schools closed, those pupils were transported by bus to Rosedale, which greatly increased the enrolments and assured the advancement from a Hightop to the fully equipped High School of today, with regional power connected, water laid on for the oval from the Railway supply and computers and television installed.

I understand the present enrolment at the school are twenty-one pre-school, one hundred and forty primary and two hundred and seven students attending the High School. In the early years children had to make their own way to School with a big percentage walking (in some instances several miles) some rode horses and two families travelled in horse drawn vehicles each with four or five children being transported. All had to contend with the hazards of evening storms and flash flooding of creeks on the way home, which is of vast contrast to approximately 95% of the students being transported in fourteen buses covering an area from Agnes Water in the north to Yandaran in the south, travelling on mostly bitumen or well graded roads with high level bridges spanning the creeks.



My first teacher was a Mr. Henry Eggert, who was fond of sweets and had a packet of London mixture lollies on his desk and would eat them in front of the children, which made their mouths water as lollies were not plentiful in those days.

Some of the other Principals were Messrs. Fred Willeston, Alex Peach, Jim Thiele, George Beverley, Ernie Champney and Laurie Coomber. Some of their assistants were Misses Essie Courtice, Dot Mara, Jean Brown, Doreen Foster, Virginia Doherty, Mavis Carlson, Moira Mitchell, Marj. Lloyd-Jones, Jan de Friez, Miss Crawford also Mr. Des James and Mr. Keith Wright.

I was delighted to be involved with the organising of the 50th Jubilee of the school in 1959 when twenty-three of the original first day pupils when the School was opened at the turn of the century attended and later to attend the 75th Anniversary of the Primary School, which were both well organized and very successful functions.

When I look back over my past 75 years associated with the School, I must say it has progressed far beyond my early expectations. I enjoyed serving on the School Committee for almost 20 years while our five children attended the Primary School and I am delighted to know that the children of Rosedale and surrounding districts will be well provided for with a high standard of education in the future years.

There are two gentlemen I would like to mention who made an outstanding contribution with their representations for the establishment of the High School. They are Mr. Claude Wharton, the then Minister for Works and Housing, for his part in gaining the approval for the School to be established and for this part in the erection of the excellent buildings and ground improvements, also Mr. Matt Cranitch who was Police Officer at Rosedale and who worked so tirelessly in the preparation of the submission to the Department knowing he would soon be transferred on promotion and the High School would be of no benefit to his children. Both gentlemen returned to Rosedale for the opening.

I am confident the Centenary celebrations to be held on the 13th July will be another outstanding success with many of the past teachers and students having the pleasure of meeting up with their school mates and friends, and I congratulate the organising committee for their organising ability and their great interest in the occasion.

Hector Wudley Lloyd-Jones

1919 to 1928

Teachers: Mr Eggert, Mr Willesden, Mr Peach.

Recollections on days at school with only three boys in the class and only one teacher. Wudley would usually ride a bicycle or pony to school. Children of all ages would ride to school or go by sulky. Usually it was fun and games to catch the horses. They would put up hurdles in the back paddock, but they got the cane for jumping their horses.

The Tennis court was made and erected by the pupils. The cricket pitch was made of an ant bed and constructed by parents. Games of cricket were played between teams of Rosedale, Murray's Creek and Miriam Vale Schools. The highlight in one match was when one bowler took eleven for twenty two, and one player made sixty four runs (highest score).

Two girls playing in the Miriam Vale team once bowled the Rosedale team out for thirteen runs. Boys of the School would go to swimming of a Friday after hunch, down to "Jone's Hole". All pupils of the School in 1928 witnessed the flight of Bert Hinkler as he flew by on his way to Bundaberg. That was a great event for all.

As pupils prepared for Fancy Dress, Costume Balls, School Concerts and picnics they all gave of their best and enjoyed the successful events. At Rosedale one achieved to go out and work for the community and to make what was available for a future.

I really appreciated school life.

I went to work on the family property in the butcher shop.

1927 to 1932

Upwards to six pupils in our class.

Good manners, bible lessons, sewing, daily drill and singing was part of school life.

The flag was raised daily, All excitement for all to see the "Tiny Plane". Lots of individual happenings in plays and sport. I really enjoyed the company and teaching at school and left to go to work at the "General Store" with my parents.

I attended Rosedale School in 1949, my scholarship year, which I passed. There was only one building at the time, two thunderbox toilets and an open sided playshed. The school has progressed a long way since then.


There was a tennis court and a mud cricket pitch.

Going over the ferry on Baffle Creek in the Headmaster's new Morris Oxford to play tennis against Wartburg School, which was won by Rosedale. Myself and Steve Kelly beat the two Headmasters in a doubles match at the end of the day. We also journeyed to Miriam Vale on the Rockhampton mail train to play tennis and netball. The tennis team consisted of four boys and two girls, who beat Miriam Vale's best six boys.

My two sisters and other children from Watalgan and Mullett Creek, namely McGhee and Amos families, went to school at Rosedale by train in 1926. The train was so late getting home most nights, that it was nearly time to start the next day again. Tom Callaghan's mother would give them sandwiches and cakes after school when the train was late. I rode my bike about eleven miles to school, through Murchies scrub, coming out on Rosedale Road at Black Gate Flat. One morning coming down Baldry's Hill I hit a heifer, which jumped onto the culvert at the critical moment. The next thing I knew the Roffey girls from Lowmead were standing over me asking if I was okay. I was, but my bike was too damaged for Tom Callaghan to fix.

Charlie Stockwell (the Publican of the Rosedale Hotel in 1949) started the "Big Race", which began at the Rosedale Hotel and finished at the overhead bridge on the old main road. The race on a Friday afternoon between Steve Kelly on Dick Lloyd-Jones' stallion and myself on my bike. I would get away to a flying start, by the time we got past Ruhls' sawmill Steve was catching up. With all the slobber of the horse's nose and mouth going over my hat and shirt. However, I could duck under the first bay of the bridge to win the race, as Steve would have to go down 4 bays to get under. Then it would take me 10 minutes to wash myself off in the Bottle Creek.

My three children, Linda, Robert and Narelle attended Rosedale School by bus.

One thing I recall very vividly is our High School song which is as follows:-

There's a place, on a hill
Which is Rosedale's house of learning;
Where my thoughts will always return,
It is my school.
There I strive to succeed
So that one day I'll be turning,
To a worthwhile place in our land
of the South Seas.

CHORUS

Rosedale High School,
That is my school,
With ideals second to none,
Which helps us to achieve security, we know,
Quality, diligence,
Honesty will recompense us,
Could we only live by the rule,
of Rosedale High School.

I also recall that my school days at Rosedale were very happy.

When I commenced Primary School at Rosedale in 1957 it comprised one building which contained two classrooms and a veranda on three sides. A small section of one verandah was closed off for a storeroom. Later another part of the opposite veranda was made into a very small library. In the grounds there was a basketball court and a covered sandpit and two toilet blocks.

My grade was the first high school class at Rosedale. To house this grade eight class, one third of the space under the primary school was enclosed with masonite and louvres. When I entered grade nine we were housed outside this enclosure and I can well remember its being very cold.

As we had no Home Economics or Manual Arts teachers or facilities a rail car of two carriages came to take care of these subjects for us for approximately five weeks whilst we were in grade eight.

During 1965 the High School building was erected and actually we were in it before the official opening in 1966. This school comprised two rooms - A commercial and a science room as well as a Teacher's room upstairs and the underneath the principal's office and storeroom. Instead of typewriters whilst under the primary school we used pieces of cardboard with the keys printed on them. There was great joy when our typewriters finally arrived.

Two very significant events which took place during my school days were Golden Jubilee in 1959 at which we danced the maypole and in 1966 the official opening of the High School.

I would like to pay tribute to the dedication of my teachers and especially our first school principal, Mr Coomber, our first High School teacher, Mr Halloran and our Commercial teacher, Miss McLellan for giving me the impetus to further my studies.

DIANE NEWTON (1962)

Having previously attended a larger Bundaberg School, I found Rosedale quite a change in year six. At that time there was no Secondary Department and only two classrooms for the primary school. The teachers were great, fellow students very friendly, so my memories are fond ones.

It was to follow that my year level was the first to go through the "high top", which then took year 8 out of the primary and into the secondary arena. The syllabus was all new and text books and learning materials were slow in arriving, but our teachers of the day did a sterling effort to manage, regardless of the facilities at hand. Evidence of this is the number of excellent results achieved by the students in the 1966 Junior examination.

I guess being Dux at the Inaugural Speech Night would have to count as a significant school event for me. I left the education system after year 10 when I was offered a position with the Commonwealth Bank, which was considered "a good job" at that time. I have no regrets.

An amusing event that springs to mind comes from primary years. The older brother from a family was absent on this day so the Principal asked his younger sibling, who was in year one at the time, of his whereabouts. Younger brother who had a stutter which became more pronounced when under pressure, explained in front of the whole room that his brother was sick due to the fact that he had been smoking "hor-hor-horse-sh-shit in-in p-p-p-paper, Sir".

Reminiscences of the First Assistant Teacher


Sixty-four years ago I caught the mail train from Bundaberg to Rosedale to take up a position as the first assistant teacher to be appointed to the Rosedale State School.

Mr. Jim Thiele was then the Head Teacher and he remained in that position for the two and a half years I was at the school.

Upon my arrival at Rosedale Station I was met by a very youthful Tom Callaghan and driven by horse and buggy to the Callaghan home which was to be my home for the following few years. They proved to be very happy years and I have remained very close friends with all the Cal laghan family ever since. The old school was built on low blocks near a big tree and there were always birds chattering in its branches. I had four classes to teach from Prep 1 up to Grade 2 and altogether I suppose I had about forty girls and boys in all classes. I was very proud of all those children as they were, on the whole, excellent students and I know quite a few of them are among our top citizens of today. I was transferred from Rosedale to Howard at the end of 1934 and three months later I resigned to be married.


4. CONCLUSION.



BAFFLE CREEK, MULLETT CREEK AND ARTHUR'S CREEK

These schools must be considered together as their history is intricately linked.

In 1909, Mr. William Simmonds of Baffle Creek wrote to the Minister of Education asking for the establishment of half-time schools at Baffle Creek and Mullett Creek. The children would be taught at private residences at each locality on alternate weeks.

In March 1910, the District Inspector, Mr. Clement Fox, reported that at Baffle Creek there were nine children able to attend. The half-school and teacher were accommodated in Mr. Simmond's house. There were some problems with Mullett Creek. There were only four pupils available, but Mr. Wills, a Baffle Creek parent, said he would send two of his lads by horse "to keep up the numbers at Mullett Creek". It was proposed that the teacher and school be accommodated at the residence of Mr. and Mrs. Gorton. Mr. Fox wrote "Mr. Gorton has only a rough two-roomed house and the rooms do not afford sufficient privacy. The floor is earthen and at the time of my visit, was quite wet with soakage from the high ground nearby. Rain beats through the slab walls and through the roof".

Three months later, Mr. Gorton had made cosiderable improvements by the addition of another room. "It is shut off from the rest of the residence by a wooden partition with door and the rough outside walls are lined with hessian. A nice hardwood floor has also been put down and the inside of the room looks clean and comfortable"

This accommodation was judged satisfactory and on 4th July 1910, the first teacher, Miss Charlotte Jane Smith, commenced teaching one week at Baffle Creek and one week at Mullett Creek.

Attendance at Baffle Creek half-time school was such that soon a permanent school building was erected.

However, in 1914 the Simmonds family moved from Baffle Creek. As five of the six pupils attending the school were of this family, the school was closed. The school requisites were moved to a new halftime school at Arthur's Creek. This was conducted on the verandah of the house owned by Mr. Williamson.







Er. Carter, M.L.A., called this morning and hended in the attached letter from Mrs. Williamson again urging on behalf of the residents at Arthur's Creck that a school ladding should be erected at that place. Mr. Carter considers the application is a very deserving one and he very strongly recommends it. He particularly asks that this building should be included in the list of buildings with which it is proposed to proceed at an early date. The estiloment is a vory rich Agricultural one and is, likely to grow and will be permanent. Mr. Carter explains that there will be from 20 to 30 children at the centre within a year or two. The school is at present held on the verandah of one of the acttlers houses, school work is carried on under very dissivantageous circumstances and with much inconvenience to the settler and his family. The attendance is exceedingly heavy and Mr. Carter thinks that the residents have shown their earnestness in the matter by sending their children to school so regularly. He thinks that if the erection of the building is indefinitely postponed the settler might be compelled to withdraw the use of his verandah and thus the children of this little group will be left without the means of education.


Mr. Carter also thinks that most sympathetic consideration should be given to these settlers who have taken up the land in new country in the genuine belief that school facilities would be provided for their children and he recommends this because case as earnestly as possible.






Berajondo Tennis Team (1914)





Berajondo Picnic Day Races (1929)



Please refer to my N/C noting on Mr. Kehoe's roport on the application for the re-opening of the Berajondo State School. I wish to report that on Thursday, 22nd October I visited the Berajondo School and held a meeting of interested parents to discuss the bost way to provide educational facilities for their children.

Before visiting the area I thought that either a school transport service or the combining of the North Beffle Creek and Berajondo Schools would best suit the purpose.

The topography of the countryelde, however, makes both of these schemes at present impracticable. The area is very hilly and is cut by numerous watercourses. When rain falls the streams rise and obstruct traffic. I was assured that all roads to Rosedala from Berajondo become distrafficable after a sharp fall of rain because of the swollen watercourses. It was possible and likely that with a fall of one inch of rain in the area, any school transport. would be held up for a considerable time. Some members at the meeting could recall the road to Rosedale being out of use for as that more than two weeks schooling would be lost each year because of wet weather. They were not in favour of a school transport service to Rosedale as they feared that their children would, on occasions, be stranded on the Rosedale side of the rising creeks.

For the same reason it was not advisable to try to combine the North Baffle and the Berajondo Schools by selecting a more central position.

The Berejondo State School building is in a poor state of repair, but it should be useful for yet a few years. White ent damage is apparent and it seems that the ants are still working in the ceilings.

I support the recommendation of the District Inspector for the re-opening of the school as it seems certain that the families in the area are stable, and there appears to be a certainty that an average attendance of 9 children can be maintained at the school for at least two years to come.

There is accommodation at Berajondo for a male teacher only.

The staffing position in this Region would make it impossible for me to appoint a single male teacher to take charge of the school before the Xmas Vacation, but I have secured the name and address of an ex-teacher in Bundaberg who may be prepared to undertake teaching duties at this school. I have written to Mr. H. A. Barke, Electha Street, Bundaberg in this regard.

FLINDERS SCHOOL

Flinders School was situated on the southern bank of Baffle Creek about 2 miles downstream from the site of Wartburg School. The land on which the school was built had belonged to Miriam Vale Shire and had originally been part of Baffle Creek Station.

The first teacher, Miss Annie Mischke, took up her appointment on 28th November, 1911.

The first school committee consisted of Messrs Francis Wills (Chairman and Secretary), Herman Kroning (Treasurer), Samuel Rothman, Herman Neumann and Otto Wendtland.

A list of children able to attend the school was drawn up as follows: Heinrich Geurring, Lydia Kroning, James Neimeyer, Hermann, Wilhelm and Edward Wendtland, Johanna, Heinrich and Friedrich Grundwald, Edith and Albert Neumann, Walter Kirchner.

Several of these children lived north of Baffle Creek and this caused problems in 1913.

In November 1913, the chairman of the school committee, Mr F.H Wills wrote to the Department of Public Instruction about a matter of very great importance. A committee member, Mr H. C Neumann, used to convey some of the students across Baffle Creek in a boat. Since his death other arrangements had to be made. The teacher, Mr Albert Diete, had told the parents that he would not ferry the children across the creek. Mr Wills stated, "As this teacher takes so little interest in the children, I think his recall desirable and someone who would take an interest in school matters, sent here."







The teacher, Mr Albert Diete, replied:

"I have the honour to state that it is possible for me to give some assistance ... There is a boat provided for the purpose. There are four children coming across at present; and I can ascertain, there will be one more coming after the New Year, and, as time goes on there will be more coming. The creek is about 150 yards to 200 yards wide at the crossing opposite the school - the breakers are very large at times. I am studying at present, so rowing across every morning and night will interfere a little, but I shall do it..."

The District Inspector, Mr W. Taylor, reported that he did not think Mr Diete should be required to row a boat across the Baffle Creek tideways as he was of slight build and had a disability as a result of an accident.

What the final outcome was is not clear, but Mr Diete was not transferred from Flinders School until 3 years later.

An enrolment of only 10 caused the school to be closed in early 1922, but the school was re-opened in July 1922 following the arrival of a further six children.

Flinders State School finally closed at the end of 1923.







TOTTENHAM SCHOOL

Tottenham State School was situated on the southern side of Baffle Creek about 6 miles from Rosedale and 4 1/2 miles from North Baffle Creek. The school was built by Mr A.H. Pershouse for a cost of 133 pounds. It consisted of a single room 26' x 16' and two verandahs.


Tottenham was originally opened as a provisional school on 27th July 1903.

The first school committee consisted of: Messrs Ernest Weller (Chairman), John Bates (Secretary), Lois Olsen (Treasurer), Samuel Rothman and John Grills.

Twenty-three pupils were listed as being able to attend: Mary and George Hales, Matine, Jacob and Katie Olsen, Ernest, Elizabeth, Emma and Isabella Grills, Frederikke, Erna, Elna, Peder and Harturg Bulow, Alex and Louisa Rothman, Amelia, William, Arthur, Walter and George Wills, Roselina and Arthur Dabelstein.

The school was closed between May 1915 and January 1927 and finally closed on 31st August 1942.

The Tottenham school building was moved to Mullet Creek in 1919 and the land sold to Mr P.N. Hinricks.





NORTH BAFFLE CREEK SCHOOL

The first school in the region was North Baffle Creek. A public meeting was held in June 1897 with the result that a request was made to the Minister for Education for the establishment of a provisional school. The school was sited on a part of Taunton Run. A school committee was formed with the following members: Messrs Alfred Pershouse, James Manning, James Wotton, Walter McClure, Harry Walker, Robert Hay and Joshua Head (Secretary).

Eleven children were listed as being able to attend the school: Helen, Albert, Martha and Mabel Hay, Willie, Florence and Grace Walker, David, Ada and Vella McClure.

The first teacher, Mr Joseph Cummings commenced duties on 9th May, 1898.

The original school consisted of a single classroom with one verandah. A second verandah was added in 1916. The building was not lined and ceiled until 1933.

North Baffle Creek was closed between 17th September, 1945 and 5th June, 1950 due to low numbers. It finally closed on 26th June, 1960.







Regulations under "The State Education Act of 1875," Clause 8.

ESTABLISHMENT OF PROTISIONAL SCHOOLS.

8. (a.) Under ordinary circumstances the Minister will not establish Provisional schools except in places distant at least four miles from any existing State or Provisional school by the nearest route practicable for children, and unless the average attendance of pupils is likely to reach twelve at the least.

(b.) A building provided by the local promoters at their own expense will be approved by the Minister for a Provisional school if it is suitable as regards situation, form, and size; if it is weatherproof, sufficiently lighted and furnished; and if there is detached closet accommodation for each sex. It should contain at least 20: square feet of flooring, the desks must be sufficient to accommodate at least two-thirds of the children, and there must be sents and hat pogs for all. The school must be furnished with a blackboard (8 feet 6 inches x 2 feet 0 inches) and easel, a clock, a press for the reception of school books, a table, and a chair. The closets must be at least a chain from each other, and from the school.

(c.) Out of money voted by Parliament for the purpose, the Minister may contribute towards the cost of a Provisional school building, and of providing the required furniture, tanks, and closets, on the following conditions:—


(1) That the local promoters have first submitted their proposals to the Department with an estimate of the cost, and have applied for and obtained from the Minister a premise to contribute to the same;


(2) That the amount so contributed by the Department shall be not more than one-half of the total cost, and not more than £50;

(3) That the building shall be placed on Crown lands if a central and otherwise suitable site thereon can be obtained; or, if built on private land, that a right-of-way shall be secured, and the land required leased to the Secretary for Public Instruction for a term of years to be agreed upon, at a nominal rent, the Minister having the right to remove the building before or at the expiration of that term;

(4) That the building shall be not less than 21 feet in length by 14 feet in width and 0 feet in height to the wall-plates, and shall have a pitched roof, two or more windoms, and a bearded floor, a verandah 7 feet wide on one side, two closets at least a chain apart, and at least a chain from the school, a tank of a minimum capacity of 400 gallons, and the following articles of furniture, viz.—four desks each 7½ feet long, aix forms each 7½ feet long, a blackboard (3 feet 6 inches x 2 feet 0 inches) and easel, a press (3 feet x 4 feet x 1½ feet), a table, a chair, a clock; building and furniture to be in accordance with plans and specifications approved by the Minister;

(5) That payment of the said contribution shall not be made until an inspector or other person authorised by the Minister has reported the building to be erected and furnished in accordance with the foregoing conditions, and that it is ready for occupation.


