The surveys are completed by a sample of students in Years 5, 6, 8, and 11 (and Years 4, 7, 9 and 10 in smaller schools), all families including parents/caregivers with students in Prep Year or special schools and all school staff including principals.

Response rates are unknown due to changes in the population during survey periods (e.g. student mobility) and timing differences with other collections.




## This is a good school

In each of the surveys, parents/caregivers, students and staff are asked whether they agree with the statement "This is a good school".

**In 2018 most agreed "This is a good school"**. Parents/caregivers had the highest level of total positive agreement (93.2%), followed by staff (93.0%) and students (87.8%).






# Satisfaction across surveys

Other common questions asked across surveys relate to themes such as **academic achievement and learning**, **wellbeing**, **engagement and school climate**.

In 2018, students were less likely than staff or parents/caregivers to agree on most of the items about **wellbeing and engagement**.



# Satisfaction across survey items

Parents/caregivers are most satisfied. Total positive agreement was above 91.8% for one half of all items answered by parents/caregivers compared with 91.0% for students and 89.1% for staff.

The most positive items related to teacher expectations of students while the most negative items related to communication and behaviour management.






### Most/least positive items in 2018 by survey group

# **Teachers and principals**

A small subset of items are asked of teaching staff and principals to gauge their satisfaction on a range of areas specific to their roles.

### **Teachers**

Teachers are generally confident in their abilities and knowledge in a range of areas

### I feel confident:

- applying evidence-based teaching and learning practices (98.5%)
- in my knowledge of evidence-based teaching and learning practices (98.4%)
- using curriculum support materials to enhance student learning at my school (98.2%)
- in my knowledge of the Australian and Queensland curriculums (98.0%)
- using student assessment data to improve student achievement at my school (97.9%)
- in my ability to work autonomously (97.8%)
- engaging all of my students in learning at my school (96.0%)
- managing the behaviour of all of my students at my school (93.0%)
- embedding Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander perspectives across the learning areas (89.3%)



**Principals** 

Principals are confident leading their schools



- I feel confident in my educational leadership role at my school (99.9%)

- I feel confident leading improvements in student outcomes at my school (99.9%)
- I feel confident using school data to improve student outcomes at my school (99.8%)
- Teaching staff at my school have the skills to improve student outcomes (99.3%)
- I feel well supported by the department to lead my school (94.7%)
