Minor and machinery in nature	The proposal is minor and machinery in nature and is a routine update with no substantive regulatory or policy change. The administrative costs to the Department of Education (DoE) are not the focus for this summary IAS.
	The Queensland Police Services (QPS) undertakes criminal history checks on behalf of government agencies in Queensland as part of the nationally coordinated criminal history check with the Australian Criminal Intelligence Commission (ACIC) under the Australian Crime Commission Act 2002 (Cth) and Australian Crime Commission (National Policing Information Charges) Act 2016 (Cth).
	The criminal history check fee (CHC fee) charged by QPS comprises the QPS processing fee component and the ACIC fee component, with the fee value for each component determined by the respective entity.
	While the QPS fee component in the CHC fee did not increase for the 2024–25 financial year, remaining at \$6.50 as the previous 2023–24 financial year, the ACIC fee component in the CHC fee increased from 1 July 2024 to \$28.00 from \$21.00, pursuant to the Australian Crime Commission (National Policing Information Charges) Determination 2024 (Determination) made under the Australian Crime Commission (National Policing Information Charges) Act 2016 (Cth).
	Accordingly, the CHC fee payable to QPS has increased from \$27.50 to \$34.50 from 1 July 2024 (which includes the unchanged QPS fee component of \$6.50 and increased ACIC fee component of \$28.00).
	The Amendment Regulation updates the CHC fee in the education portfolio under the Education (General Provisions) Regulation 2017 and Education (Queensland College of Teachers) Regulation 2016, to

maintain its exact value as advised by the QPS, and to accurately reflect the cost of providing services.
The Amendment Regulation enables DoE and the Queensland College of Teachers to recover the full cost of CHC Fees and does not result in a substantive change to regulatory policy.
