### Table 1: Students by region

- A total of 567,806 students were enrolled in Queensland state schools in February 2025
- From 2021 to 2025, enrolments decreased by -12,366 (-2.1%).
- In 2025, the largest proportion of state school students were in Metropolitan South Region (23.1%), South East Region (19.7%), and Metropolitan North Region (18.3%).

# Table 3: Aboriginal students and Torres Strait Islander students by region

- A total of 68,116 Aboriginal students and Torres Strait Islander students were enrolled in Queensland state schools in February 2025, making up 12.0% of all Queensland's state school students.
- From 2021 to 2025, Aboriginal students and Torres Strait Islander student enrolments grew by 4,711 (7.4%), compared to -2.1% for all students.
- In 2025, the largest proportion of Aboriginal students and Torres Strait Islander students were in Far North Queensland Region (17.6%), North Queensland Region (13.8%), and Metropolitan South Region (13.4%).
