

Student attendance by year level

- The student attendance rate is based on Semester 1 each year and is generated by dividing the total of full-days and part-days that students attended, and comparing this to the total of all possible days for students to attend, expressed as a percentage.
- The overall 2019 student attendance rate for all Queensland state schools was 90.5 per cent, 0.4 percentage points lower than the 2018 attendance rate.
- Individual school attendance rates are published on school websites as a part of the School Annual Report. The My School (www.myschool.edu.au) website also provides individual school attendance rates along with other information about each school.
- When analysing attendance data over time, it should be noted that extreme events such as cyclones, flooding and pandemics may have impacted on the data in certain years.
