Discrete Communities Renewal program

Improving schools for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander communities.

The Discrete Communities Renewal (DCR) program is a department program which provides funding to better plan, improve and build educational buildings and spaces for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander communities.

The planning for improved and/or new educational buildings and spaces is being done in partnership with Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander communities. The department is working with local communities to identify and co-design the improvements and/or new educational spaces, and sharing decision-making responsibilities around outcomes.

Co-designing Yarrabah's Education Master Plan

For the past 12 months, Yarrabah Aboriginal Shire Council members and key school community members have been working with the department to share information, develop a vision and identify short-term, medium-term and long-term educational improvements and new buildings and spaces.

The master plan sets out a 10+ year vision for Yarrabah State School. The outcomes we hope to achieve are:

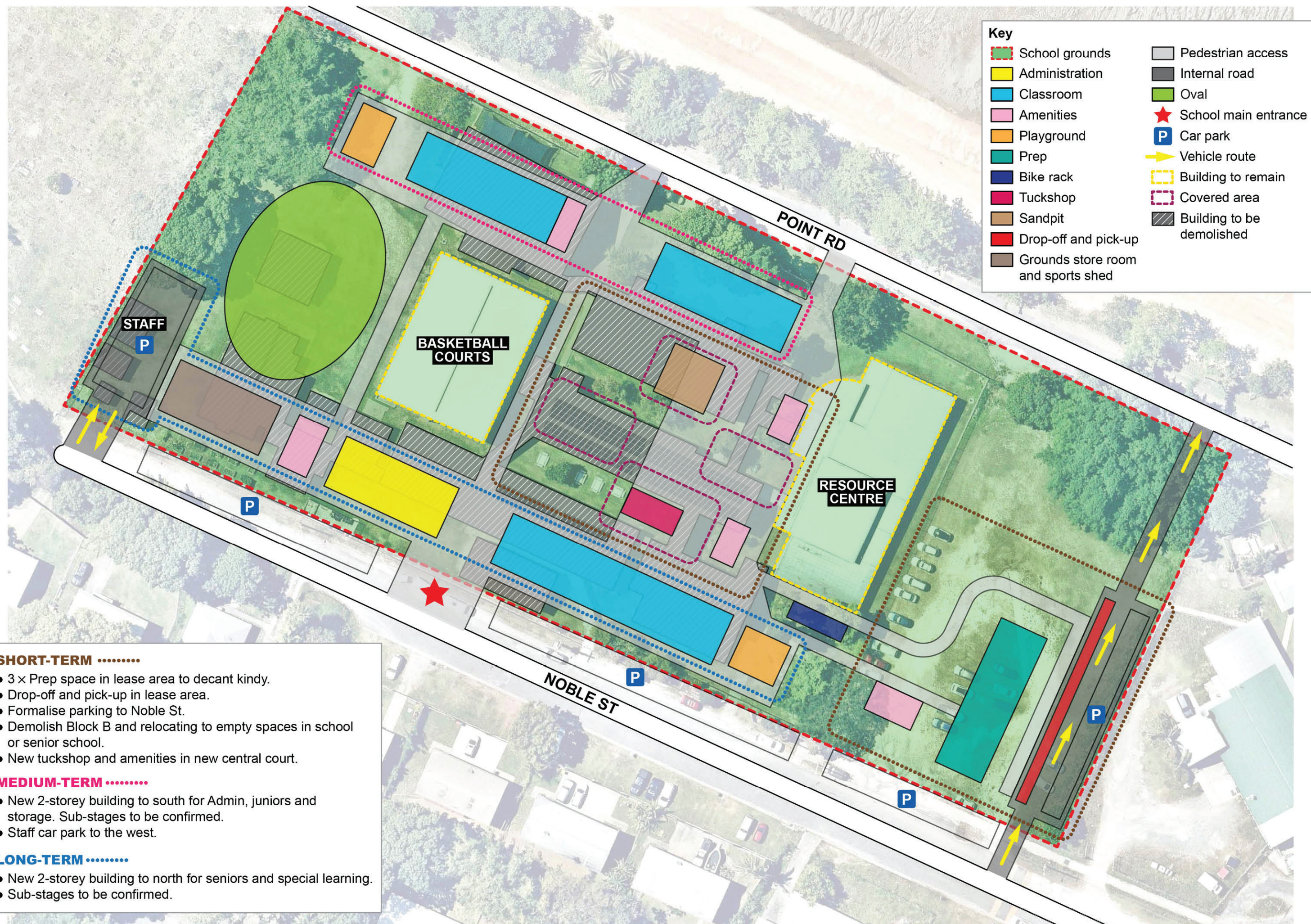
- short-term project/s – within the next 3 years, identify and fund improvements to an existing space or building a new space
- medium-term project/s – identify potential projects and seek future funding
- long-term project/s – identify potential projects and seek future funding.



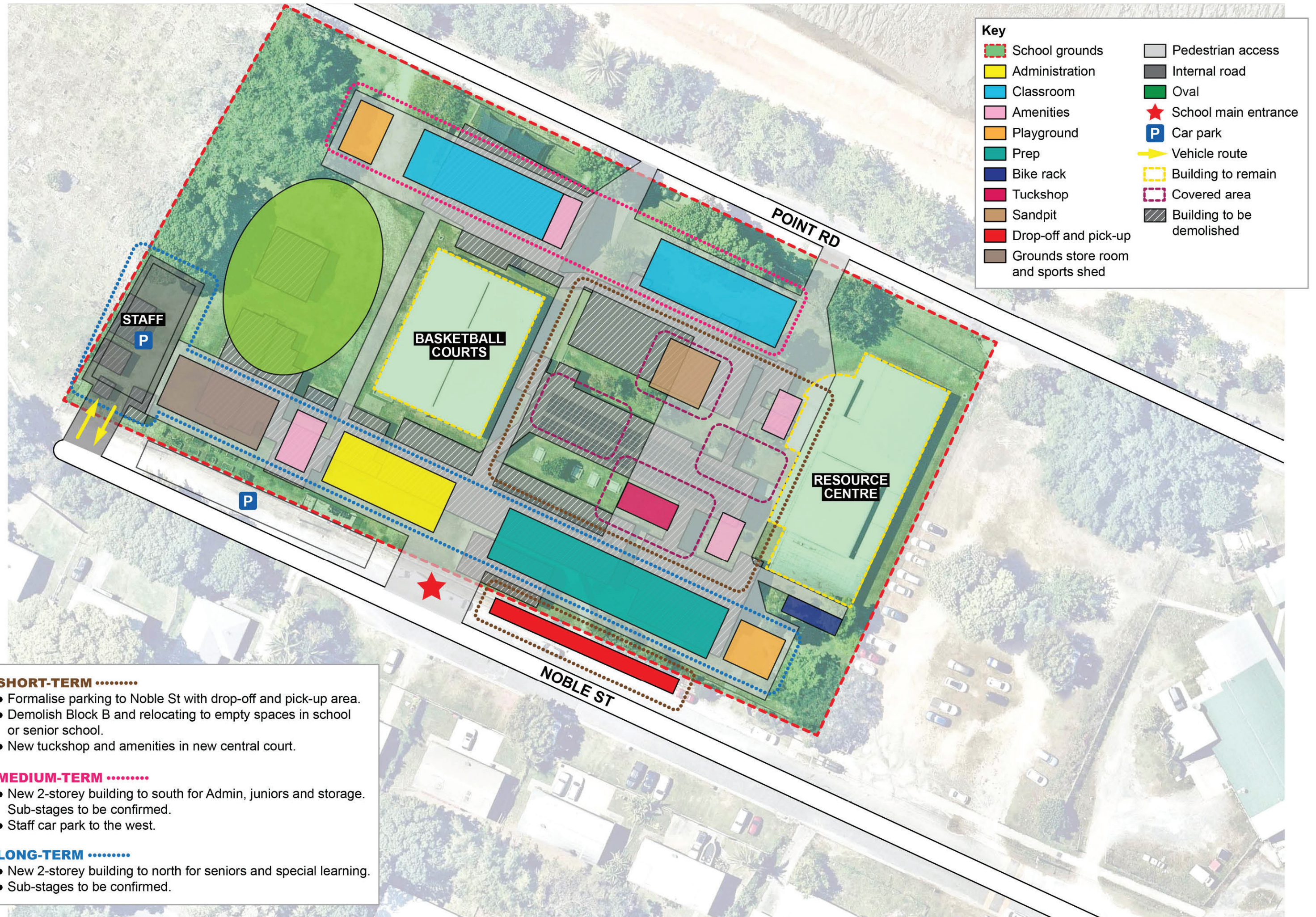
Yarrabah State School — existing site plan

Information sharing

Let's talk about what your community needs, who we should talk to, how you want us to speak with you and what our program can do.

2

Vision

Let's work out a dream/idea we can achieve.

3

Education Master Plan and a Project Concept Plan

Let's develop a long-term, 10-year plan for the school and a 3-year project we can fund and build soon.

4

Stakeholder review

Let's discuss and improve with a select group of people.

5

The program is at this stage

Community consultation

Let's discuss the plan with the entire community, ask for feedback and improve the plan.

6

Final stakeholder review

Let's have one last review of the plan with a select group of people.

7

Endorsement

Let's seek approval and build our project.
